INFO: Puppies and kittens must be 8 weeks old, weigh over 2 pounds and be weaned. Mother dogs and cats must have their litters weaned, plus another week's delay before surgery. Dogs and cats can be spayed while in heat but there is a greater risk of complication. **NO FLEAS PLEASE!!** The vet may charge you for flea treatment.
